In the course we cover Planning activities, range safety, basic skills, how to make it fun, coaching philosophy, safety, equipment management, youth development that sort of thing.

Similar to the Level 1 (Instructor of Beginners), this type of instructor teaches basic skills to individuals with very little or no experience in the sport or the activity. They deal with a limited number of participants at a time and focus on the fundamentals of the activity with an emphasis on safety.

Archery Alberta in partnership with Archery Canada is pleased to announce a new “Non-Competitive” coaching clinic with the new ARCHERY FOUNDATIONS program being developed through Archery Canada. The new ARCHERY FOUNDATIONS program is designed to introduce individuals who work for summer camps and additional programs to learn the absolute basics of coaching and other areas where archery is being taught on a non-competitive level. This new stream will be accessible via the NCCP. Those who complete the new Archery Foundations program will have a better understanding of what it means to coach and teach new individuals in the sport of Archery.

This course is a 1 day, 8 hour in person course. Time 9:00am to 7:00pm. On Sunday they can practice shooting and teaching.

Pre-Requisite: - 3 Online Course - 2 are quick and free 10-15 mins 20-30 mins
One is longer \$30 and is reimbursable if a member of the Alberta Archery

Cost:

The Waterfront Instructor can instruct a Waterfront Program.

Waterfront Instructor Tandem Program provides the theory and skills necessary for Instructors to lead basic canoeing skills and activities in a safe controlled environment. The Instructor Program includes: basic equipment care and safety knowledge, canoe over canoe and towing rescues, specialized equipment, forward & turning strokes, participant safety and limitations, and a variety of games to complement stroke development.

The successful Waterfront Instructor candidates are considered a canoeist who has the knowledge, experience, and skill to teach and demonstrate all the necessary skills for the Waterfront program. The Waterfront Instructor will be able to safely implement a Waterfront Program for novice level canoeists in a designated calm flatwater environment. The Waterfront Instructor can instruct a Waterfront Program.

Pre-requisites

- 16 years of age or more,
- Member In Good Standing with Paddle Canada and the local Regional Member Association (where applicable),
- Basic Tandem Paddling Skills

Instructor Participant Ratio

- 1:10

CLIMBING

INSTRUCTORS: Adventure Works, Ontario

For over 25 years they've been leaders in developing the international standards for excellence in challenge course programming.

Minimum would be 6 people. Max 10.

Course Description

Participants will be trained for usage at both camp climbing walls and rock faces.

A 2- day top rope basics for outdoor rock climbing training be provided to staff. The two-day workshop prepares individuals to participate in single pitch top rope rock climbing in outdoor crag settings. Participants will develop safe attitudes towards climbing and repelling by learning and practicing the basic technical safety management skills required for climbing in the outdoor environment. By the end of the course instructor candidates will:

- Have the outdoor rock climbing skills including the belaying, knot tying, personal protective equipment and equipment use and care.
- Develop skills for rigging anchors using bolts or natural protection.
- Have the skills to safely set up a personal rappel system.
- Learn and practice safe operation and management aspects of top rope climbing sites
- Develop a principle and systems-based approach to climbing systems and risk management.

Prerequisites

- 18 years of age
- Willingness and ability to perform all tasks related to climbing operation including spotting delaying climbing on bullet and repelling.

HIKING

OCC _ Outdoor Council of Canada certification

The Hiking Field Leader course provides the foundations for designing and leading safe and enjoyable hiking experiences for any age group. The Outdoor Council of Canada teaches a "participant centered" approach where the trip is designed with the participants front of mind. Specifically, this course will help you:

1. Learn to design, plan and lead safe and high quality events for others.
2. Learn group management techniques, terrain identification and management techniques, and interpretive tips.
 3. Tailor the trips you offer to suit the particular goals of your group or your organization.
4. Learn industry-accepted techniques to provide proper care for your clients.
5. Learn how to identify, assess, and manage risks found outdoors.
